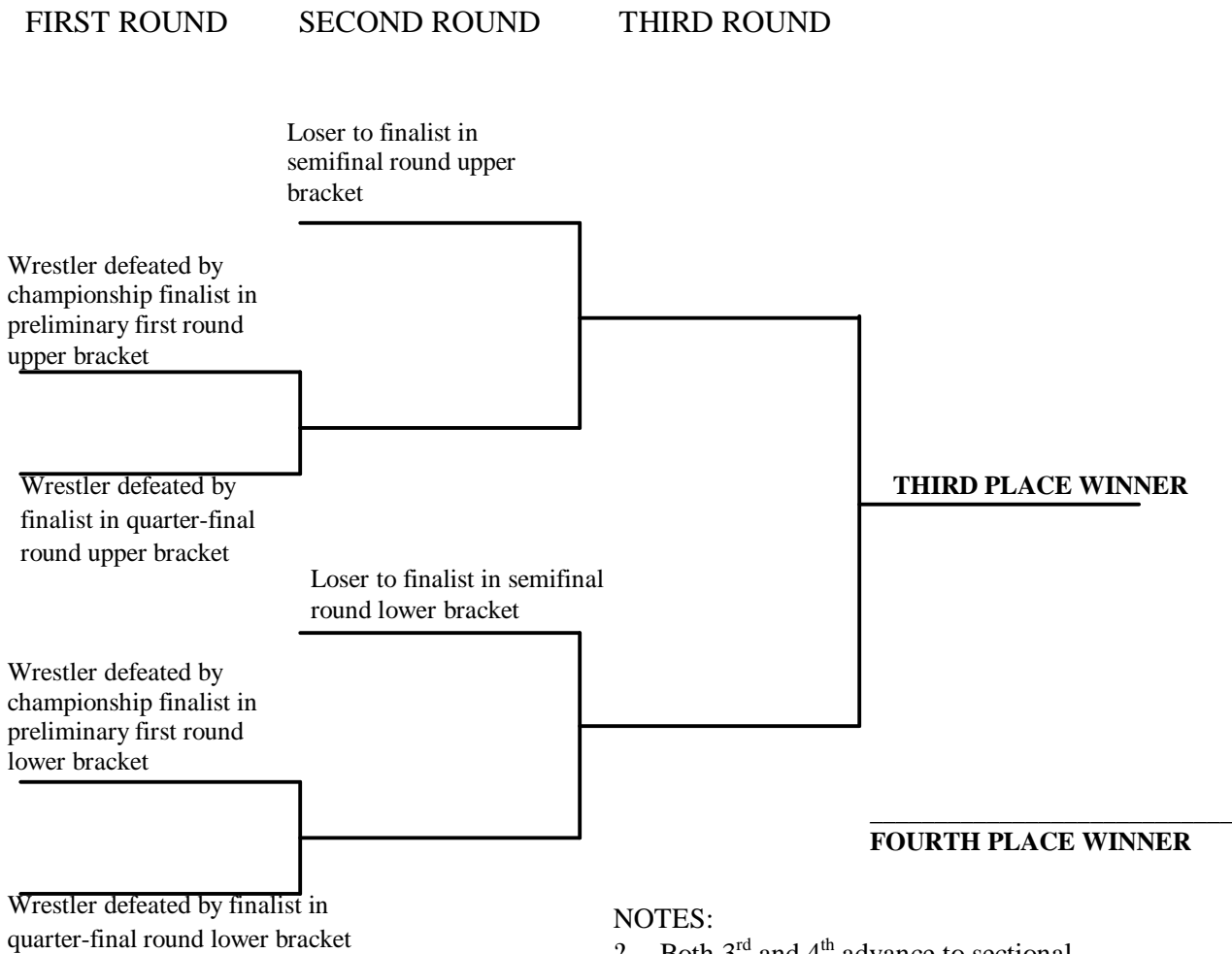


Consolation Bracket for Championship Brackets with 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, or 18 Wrestlers

Wrestlebacks – for wrestlers defeated by the two finalists



NOTES:

- ? Both 3rd and 4th advance to sectional.
- ? There is a chance for a Bye in the first round of the wrestlebacks.
- ? If consolation bracket qualifiers have wrestled one another in the championship bracket, the result of the championship bracket bout stands in the consolation bracket and the winner earns automatic advancement to the next round in the consolation bracket.
- ? **If you have a 17 or 18 man bracket, the wrestler defeated in the pigtail match is eliminated and does not advance to the wrestleback round even if the wrestler who defeated him wins his preliminary first round bout.**
- ? **If the wrestler who won the pigtail match ends up in the wrestleback, remember he can only wrestle 5 matches in a day. If a 6th match is necessary, it would occur in the 3rd round of the wrestleback. In this case, the wrestler who has already wrestled 5 times must forfeit the last match. He would receive 4th place but still advance to the sectional meet.**
