IMPORTANT SCHOLASTIC BOWL DATES

October 5 - Initial Entry Deadline: All schools must submit their entry for the activity postmarked by this date. Invoices are created online in the member center with a school password.

January 25 - Matches may begin: Schools participating in the activity may not start match play before this date.

March 1 - Final Entry Deadline

March 23 - Step One of Online Seeding Closed: All schools must enter their record to participate in the state series. During step one of this process, school will enter their record, team schedule and results, as well as a brief description of why their team should be ranked. Teams will also submit regional hosting requests at this step.

March 25-30 - Step Two of Online Seeding—RANKING: All schools will go online and rank the top eight (8) schools in their sectional. Rank the teams according to the information gathered in step one of the seeding process. Following this step the IESA will publish regional assignments based on geography and regional host identified. Every effort will be made to separate the top four seeds in each sectional. This is often impacted by who volunteers to host and geography of the sectional.

April 28 - Regional Tournaments: Regional tournament are the first level of state series play. Even though schools are first assigned to a sectional and seed at the sectional level, *all regional tournaments take place prior to sectional tournaments*. There are 64 regional sites that advance to their respective sectional tournaments.

May 3 - Sectional Tournaments: there are sixteen sectional tournaments (eight per class) and there are four teams in each sectional site. This competition is run as a 4-team round robin. The winner advances to state.

May 7 - State Tournament is held at Heartland Community College in Normal, IL. sixteen teams advance (eight per class). The playing order for each pool is randomly drawn at the scholastic bowl advisory committee meeting each year.
