2008 ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES & RECOMMENDATIONS

February 28, 2008

The following members were present for the meeting: Administrator, Chris Carter, Morton; Coach, Jim Valla, Elmwood; Coach, Andre Rogers, Chicago Providence-St. Mel; Coach, Amy Mayer, Rantoul St. Malachy; Coach, Brent Grisham, Mt. The IESA Basketball Advisory Committee, in its meeting of February 28, 2008, makes the following recommendations to the Board of Directors for their April 4, 2008 meeting:

- 1. By-laws and Terms & Conditions changes/recommendations:
 - a. 4.045 Individual Limitations: For regular season contests, students on teams in Class 3A and Class 4A shall be limited to a maximum of four (4) quarters per night. For regular season contests, students on teams in Class 1A and Class 2A shall be limited to a maximum of five (5) quarters per night. DEFEATED.

Rationale: The additional quarter will help to facilitate the seasons of smaller schools. The Committee does not view this as an advantage to these teams. It is the hope of the Committee that the additional quarter will provide personnel for member schools that need to use 5^{th} , 6^{th} , and 7^{th} grade students on their 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade teams.

b. 4.045 Individual Limitations: Students in 5th or 6th grade who participate on the school's 7th and/or 8th grade teams must abide by all IESA rules and regulations during the season for that sport. DEFEATED.

Rationale: This would require 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students to abide by all IESA rules and regulations during the season for that sport, but would not require those students to continue to abide by the rules and regulations once their IESA season is concluded. This change to the bylaw was drafted for those 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students who play up on the $7^{th}/8^{th}$ team and also play on $5^{th}/6^{th}$ grade school team. Currently, 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students who participate on the 7^{th} and/or 8^{th} grade team are required to count all of their quarters toward their season total ($5^{th}/6^{th}/7^{th}/8^{th}$). For smaller schools that need to use 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students to field a $7^{th}/8^{th}$ grade team, the requirement to count all quarters restricts these students' ability to play on a school team with their classmates. Fifth and sixth grade seasons often occur at or near the end of the IESA basketball seasons. Historical note: The Board granted an exception to 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students. The exception allowed 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students who participate on the $7^{th}/8^{th}$ grade team the ability to continue to participate on a $5^{th}/6^{th}$ school team beyond the designated IESA season. The Committee is putting forth their recommendation with the belief that 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade students would still be offered this exception.

c. 4.043 Team Limitations: Only during a regular season tournament may a basketball team representing a member school be permitted to play in more than one contest per day. See 4.045 for individual limitations. Exceptions- During regional tournament play, teams will be allowed to participate in more than one regional contest per day. On the Saturday of the IESA state finals, participating teams will be permitted to play in more than one state series contest per day. Approved

Rationale: The ability to participate in more than one regional game per day would reduce the potential travel of teams during the regional. This ability would reduce the need to travel

during the week on school nights. The schedule would be determined by the host school.

- d. Seeding Procedures: to add to Factors to be considered in seeding
 - i. Post-season roster Approved

Rationale: This factor should be taken into consideration when seeding. Altering the playing roster by adding or deleting players affects strength of the team.

- 2. To make the following changes to the IESA Basketball State Final time schedule.
 - a. Saturday: Game #1- 10:00 am; Game#2- 11:30 am; Game#3- 1:00 pm; Game#4- 2:30 pm; Game#5- 5:00 pm; Game#6- 6:30 pm Approved
 - b. No changes were made to the Thursday time schedule

Rationale: The Committee discussed the recommendations from those who had participated in the tournaments the last two years. The Committee is fortunate to have members who have participated in the tournaments the past two years. The Committee felt that reducing the wait time between a team's first and second game would be more advantageous to the participating teams. The Committee also discussed how the time schedule would potentially impact the host schools. The Committee felt that the host schools would have to alter little to their current set-up.
