IESA Scholastic Bowl Advisory Committee Meeting Thursday, May 30, 2019 10:00 a.m., IESA Office, Bloomington

The IESA Scholastic Bowl Advisory Committee, in its meeting of May 30, 2019, makes the following recommendations to the Board of Directors for their June 14, 2019 meeting:

1. Rule Change

Recommendation 1

Current: If more than two teams have equal record in any pool tournament, a tiebreaker round shall be held with rematches between those teams in the order of the initial tournament schedule.

b. Only special tiebreaker toss-up and bonus questions shall be used.

c. Each match shall consist of 5 toss-up and accompanying bonus.

c2. If at the end of a tiebreaker match there is a tie, the moderator will ask an additional toss-up plus 4-part bonus until a winner is determined. That winner is decided by point total.

Proposed: If more than two teams have equal records in any pool tournament, a tiebreaker series round shall be held with rematches between those teams in the order of the initial tournament schedule.

b. Only special tiebreaker toss-up questions will be used

c. Each match will consist of 5 toss-up questions from 5 academic categories (all questions must be read). If there is a tie, after the 5 toss-up questions during a tiebreaker match, a sudden death toss-up question will be asked to determine a winner.

c2. In case of a tie, after the initial tiebreaker procedure between all three teams (equal number of wins and losses), repeat the tiebreaker round again between all three teams.

c3. If after the tie breaker round, two of the three teams have an equal number of wins and losses, those two teams will play a one question (sudden death) toss-up match.

Rationale: The committee feels this will speed up play in the event of a three-team tie at all levels of the state series. At many regional and sectionals, schools are driving over an hour and a half to the host site. When a tie occurs, it prolongs the night and schools are not getting home until close to midnight. It also simplifies the tiebreaker procedures.

Scholastic Bowl Rule: 1, Section 6, art. 4b, 4c. and c2 Board Action: APPROVED

2. Rule Book

Recommendation 2

Current: Under the miscellaneous question category there is nothing that refers to pop culture. Avery has been including pop culture as part of the miscellaneous category.

Proposed: Add pop culture to the miscellaneous question category

Rationale: The committee feels that adding pop culture as part of the miscellaneous category covers variety of questions that are asked in reference to video games and other topics.

Scholastic Bowl Rule: 1, Section 3, art. 2f.

Board Action: APPROVED

3. General Moderator Procedures

Recommendation 3

Current: There is nothing in the moderator instructions that refers to the underlined portion of answers. **Proposed:** Add the following to the moderator instructions under During a Match: The underlined portion of answers indicates the minimally required portion of a multi-word answer. Moderators should be aware of any additional information given as the answer that deems the answer incorrect. Units of measurement are always required in an answer that has them.

Rationale: There seems to be confusion by some moderators on what to accept and what not to accept. This language will provide clarification.
