Minutes and Recommendations May 30, 2024 Hybrid Meeting

The IESA Music Advisory Committee, in its meeting on May 30, 2024, makes the following recommendations to the Board of Directors in its June meeting:

Recommendation 1:

Current:	Accompaniment may not be mechanically recorded with the exception of the use of the SmartMusic accompaniment system. This computer program has been approved for use at IESA music contests. Schools that plan to use SmartMusic at contest must notify their contest host at least two weeks in advance. The school using SmartMusic accompaniment is responsible for supplying the necessary equipment to use Smart Music. The program must be used in the proper settings and should be set to follow the performer. It is recommended that the contest host set up a separate SmartMusic room if entries warrant. If SmartMusic will be used, please indicate this in the accompaniment column.
Proposed:	 Recorded accompaniment shall be allowed provided the following conditions are met: The student (s) must use some type of sound system or Bluetooth Speaker. The student and director are responsible for audio set up. Setup for the recorded accompaniment should not detract from the performance time limit. Any violation of the above guidelines would result in a penalty and the event's ranking being lowered a division. SmartMusic can still be used by schools.
Rationale:	Allowing a recorded accompaniment would allow for more flexibility. It would not restrict to the specific use of SmartMusic. This would give more schools options, especially those with limited Wi-Fi capabilities. Could also help with accompaniment costs/finding.
