# 2018-19 IESA CHESS ADVISORY MEETING

# Minutes and Recommendations March 6, 2019

The IESA Chess Advisory Committee, in its meeting on March 6, 2019, makes the following recommendations to the IESA Board of Directors for their April 5, 2019, meeting:

# Recommendation 1- By-laws and Terms and Conditions

**Current** Schools may list up to three (3) alternates per division on the online roster entry form. Schools may

substitute players from the online roster entry form up until the end of the registration period on the

first day of tournament play. Because this is an individual tournament and not a board-team tournament, substitutions are not permitted after the end of the registration period. Alternates not

used as substitutes by 9:00 am on Friday are not permitted to compete in the tournament.

**Proposed** Schools may list up to five (5) alternates per division on the online roster entry form. Schools may

substitute players from the online roster entry form up until the end of the registration period on the

first day of tournament play. Because this is an individual tournament and not a board-team

tournament, substitutions are not permitted after the end of the registration period. Alternates not

used as substitutes by 9:00 am on Friday are not permitted to compete in the tournament.

**Rationale** Because of the high percentage of students who do not end up coming to the competition,

increasing the number of alternates will allow coaches more flexibility and will make substitutions

easier on the pairings personnel.

## **Recommendation 2- By-laws and Terms and Conditions**

**Current** If both players are late for the start of a round, the first player to arrive must split the elapsed time

and then start the opponent's clock. If neither player has a clock, the elapsed time from the start of the round must be split equally when one is obtained. Competitors may need the assistance of a

Steward for this procedure.

#### **Recommendation 3- By-laws and Terms and Conditions**

**Current** Participants are warned before the st

Participants are warned before the start of each round that cell phones must be turned off completely or placed on silent. A cell phones that goes off in the playing area will result in the following penalties:

- a. Player's cell phones in use forfeiture of game.
- Player's cell phones/smart devices vibrating or ringing loss of five minutes off clock but not to be lowered past one minute of the time remaining. A second violation would result in a forfeiture of game.

c. No headphones of any type may be worn in the playing area.

**Proposed** Participants are warned before the start of each round that cell phones/smart devices must be

turned off completely or placed on silent. A cell phones/smart devices that goes off in the playing

area will result in the following penalties:

a. Player's cell phones/smart devices in use - forfeiture of game.

b. Player's cell phones/smart devices vibrating or ringing - loss of five minutes off clock but not to be lowered past one minute of the time remaining. A second violation would result in a forfeiture of game.

c. No headphones of any type may be worn in the playing area.

Rationale Restriction on spectator electronic devices removed. Not enough personnel to police. Additionally,

as long as the devices are not interrupting play, there is no need to restrict from the viewing area.

- 1. Discussed a change to the time control. No recommendation.
- 2. Discussed current coach ranking procedure. No recommendation, keep current ranking system.
- Discussed modification to the current awards disbursement. No recommendation. The Committee
  recommends that only the awards for individuals receiving gold and silver medallions be announced.
  Individuals receiving Bronze medals will be able to pick up their medals after the awards ceremony, but will
  not be announced.

- 7. Discussed pairing. The pairings room will make every effort to cross-section pair if students within different sections are assigned byes. The students will still receive their wins, but will now have any opportunity to play. Additionally, Betsy Zacate will provide a breakout session during Round 2 to explain how pairings are made.
- 8. Discussed the requirement of notation. No recommendation.
- 9. Discussed eliminating the use of tie-breaks for a blitz game. No recommendation.
- 10. Discussed the implementation of a class-system. Administrator to conduct a survey for interest.
- 11. Discussed the state time schedule. Fifteen minutes will be taken off of the start time for Round 7 and the Awards start time.
- 12. Discussed having our photography vendor onsite for the tournament. No recommendation.
- 13. Discussed the possibility of announcing the 8<sup>th</sup> grade team awards first. No recommendation.
