The IESA Music Advisory Committee, in its meeting on June 6, 2019, makes the following recommendations to the IESA Board of Directors for their June 14, 2019, meeting:

Recommendation 1- Terms and Conditions

Current All pieces performed at solo and ensemble contest must be a minimum of 32 measures long, not

counting repeats.

Proposed All pieces performed at solo and ensemble contest must be a minimum of 32 measures long or 60

seconds in length.

Rationale This will open up more literature options for students.

Recommendation 2- Terms and Conditions

Current Additional information: An instrumental solo may be performed on piano or <u>any instrument used in</u>

<u>band or orchestra</u> with the exception of traps or miscellaneous percussion instruments such as triangles, cymbals, maracas, batons or amplified instruments (such as synthesizers, electronic

keyboards, electric drums and electric guitars). Drum sets are allowed

Proposed Additional information: An instrumental solo may be performed on piano or any instrument as called

for in the score. Drum sets are allowed.

For any amplified instruments, performers will be required to provide all of their own equipment for

performance.

Rationale The change would now allow for amplified instruments and non-traditional instruments as called for

in a score.

Recommendation 3- Financial report

Current Hosts are sent 95% of the contest entries to help cover contest expenses. In addition, an admission

fee of \$2.00/3.00 is collected. The entry fees are combined with the collected admission money to pay contest expenses. One of the expenses of contest are awards (medals and ribbons). Hosts

reimburse the IESA for awards used at contest.

Proposed Hosts are sent 95% of the contest entries to help cover contest expenses. In addition, an admission

fee of \$1.00/2.00 will be collected. The entry fees are combined with the collected admission money to pay contest expenses. IESA will cover the award expense and it will no longer be included on the

financial report.

Rationale Reimbursement of the awards expense is always a confusing and frustrating expense for hosts. This

would eliminate a source of contention.

Admin Vote Admin Recommendation: Reduce the amount sent to hosts to 85%. Eliminate the awards expense

from the Financial Report. Admission to remain at \$2/3.

Rationale With the number of judges that are typically hired for contest, the current allowance does not cover

the true cost of providing hospitality.

Discussion Topics

- 1. Discussed the requirement of the recording judge at Organization Contest. The Committee requested that this be a point of emphasis to all schools and to hosts. This requirement will be included in the Activity Update and the host information and reminders.
- 2. Discussed Smart Music. This is a good option for schools; however, the program needs to be used in the proper settings when used at contest. Settings should be adjusted to follow the performer. Schools intending to use this software at contest need to communicate this to their contest host. Additionally, it is the requirement of the participating school to provide the necessary equipment. Other recorded accompaniment was discussed, and no recommendation was made to allow its use at contest.
- 3. Discussed the performance of popular/contemporary pieces. While there are no restrictions on the genre, the Committee cautions the performance of popular/contemporary pieces. Judges may categorize popular pieces as inappropriate for contest and will adjudicate accordingly.
- 4. Discussed the eligibility requirement. No recommendation. The Board has indicated in the past that the academic eligibility requirement applies to all IESA interscholastic activities.
- 5. Reviewed judge pay. No recommendation.
- 6. Discussed transposing music. Update the Q&A on page 8 of T&C- Q. Can a director rewrite a required part? A. Yes, provided that all parts are covered in the score, the final piece is appropriately classified based on the final instrumentation, and the score is rewritten to reflect the changes.

- 7. Discussed the use of Tourney Wire this year at all S&E contests. The Committee felt that the use of Tourney Wire was positive. There were several points that the Committee would like the Administrator to discuss with Ben.
- 8. Discussed the overall numbers of entries and schools this year at contest. Generally, entries and schools were down this year.
- 9. Discussed the National Anthem and Pep Band participation numbers. These numbers were up this year and we will continue to promote these programs.
- 10. Evaluated the currently offered events. No recommendations.
- 11. Discussed scales. No recommendation to require or to eliminate. Hosts and judges will be reminded that scales are not required. If performed, they are a bonus.
- 12. Discussed revising the rules regarding chorus. No recommendation.
- 13. Discussed the similarities/difference between IESA and IHSA.
- 14. Discussed a state list of music. A sample list will be generated and added to the website.
- 15. Discussed deadlines. No recommendation.
- 16. Discussed establishing a host rotation. No recommendation.
- 17. Discussed the admission charge. The admission charge was instituted to help hosts cover the costs of contest. Since the institution of the admission charge, very few contests have run at a deficit. This has saved hosts from covering the cost of a deficit or passing along that expense to the participating schools.
- 18. Discussed the march requirement for concert band. No recommendation.
